	Methods: We will use a combination of co-design explorative methods with conducting some face-to-face interviews with people living with dementia/carers and healthcare professionals who care for them. We will also undertake a literature review to address identified known gaps in the literature.
Expected outcomes and deliverables:	Scholars engaged in this work will gain a deeper understanding of geriatric pharmacy, optimising medication use in older people and particularly people living with dementia and deprescribing (reducing/stopping) harmful medications.
