Project title:	How can pharmacists and dental practitioners collaborate to improve patient health care?
Project duration:	6 weeks – 10 weeks
Description:	Community pharmacy staff are respected, trustworthy and knowledgeable healthcare professionals who provide numerous services to patients without charging any fees, do not require appointments for consultations and are usually in close proximity to people's homes. For many, pharmacists and pharmacy assistants are the first or only contact with a health professional about a health concern and are therefore ideally positioned to deliver preventive oral health messages/interventions. In addition, pharmacy staff are able to recognise and appropriately manage or refer a range of common oral health conditions for many groups in Australia, including disadvantaged groups who are most at risk of poor oral health. Little is known regarding how the two professions can better collaborate to achieve improved patient oral healthcare outcomes. The aim of this project is to prepare a review (approximately 3000 words) surrounding this topic.
